On Tuesday of this week I attended the Beach Road Partnership Review along with other leaders. Anne Millard, Executive Director, Partnerships, Schools and Preschools chaired the meeting which drove conversations about the impact of leaders and how we are leading improvement in our sites. I was excited to share the HHSP-7 story that the number of Year 2 students reaching benchmark in running records by the end of term 3 is the best result attained, with 71% of students achieving this milestone. This week the Life Education team with Healthy Harold visited Huntfield Heights! Each class participated in a different, age appropriate, session that focused on children and young people making safer and healthier choices. The sessions provided the information, understanding, skills and strategies students require to make safe decisions about their own health and well-being. Students got to visit the new, giant inflatable classroom which was setup in our gym.

The Preschool learnt about the importance of road safety, sun safety, water safety and safety around medicines in "Harold's Summer Holiday". Room A and Room D each learnt about safety in a range of situations and environments, people and places to go to for help, and how friends can care for and support each other in "Safety Rules!" In "bCyberwise", Room 9 students learnt about the importance of being safe and respectful online and why being a responsible digital citizen is vital for their own safety as well as their friends and family. Room 3 students participated in two sessions. Firstly, in "Decisions" students learnt about the impact alcohol and other drugs have on their bodies and empowers them to make safer and healthier choices.
